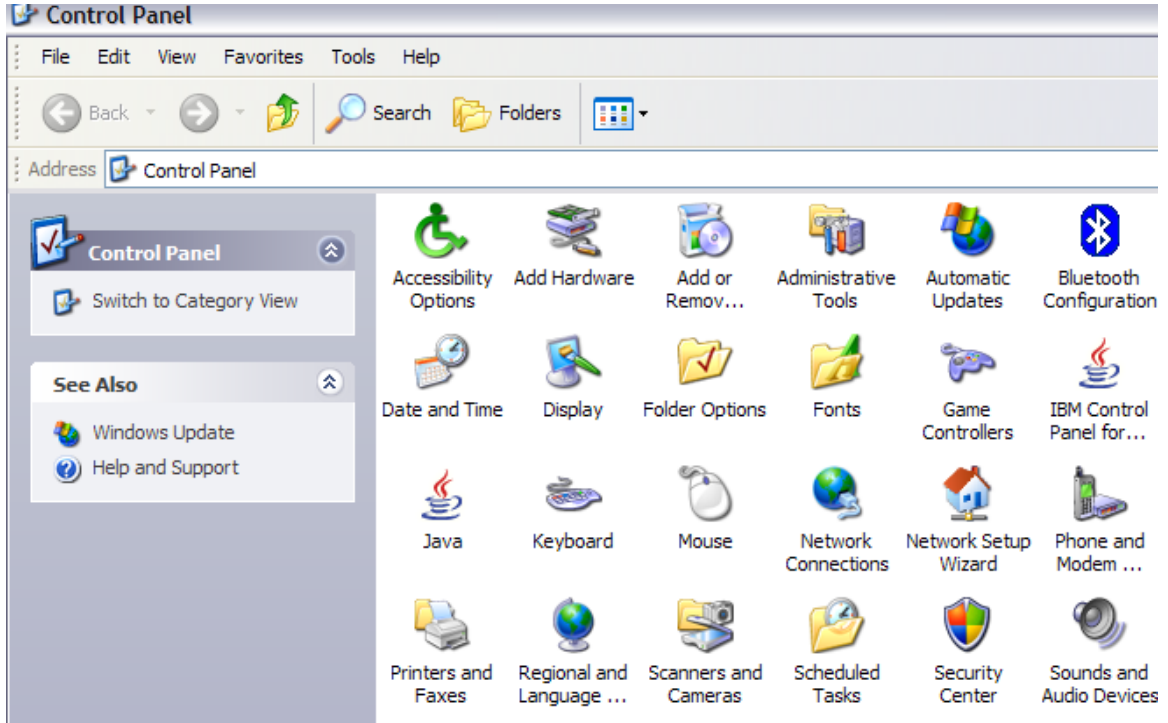


Clearing Java Cache

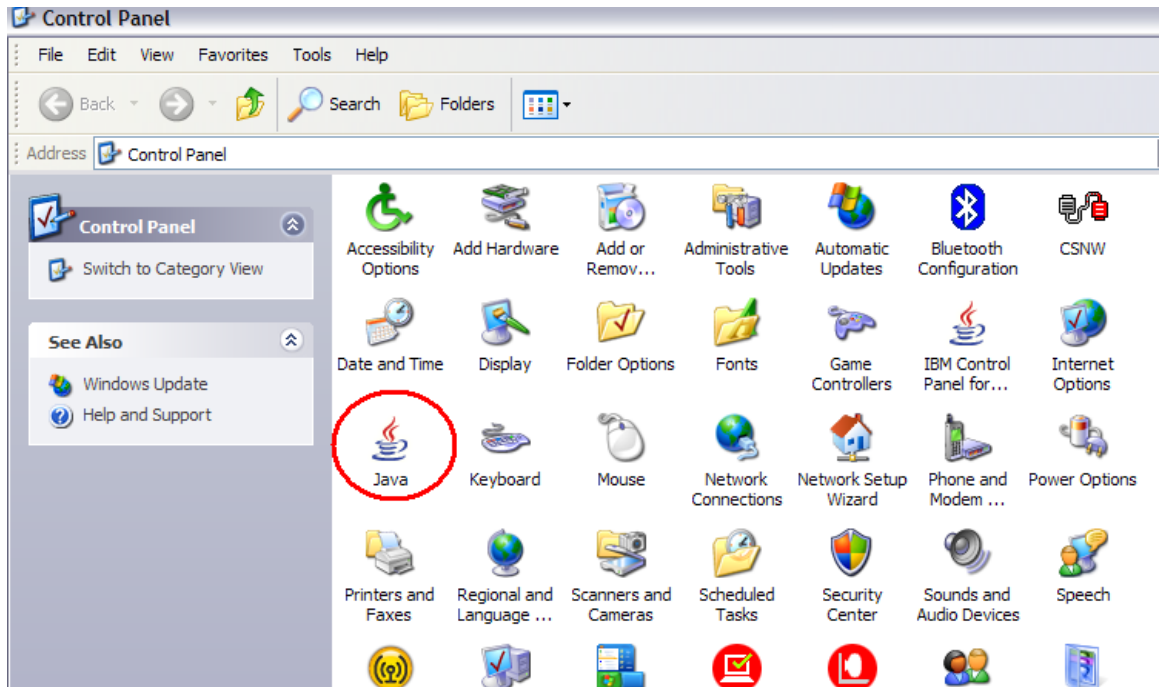
Clearing the Java cache ensures that the browser loads the latest versions of Java applications and applets.

To clear the Java Plug-in cache:

1. Click Start > Control Panel



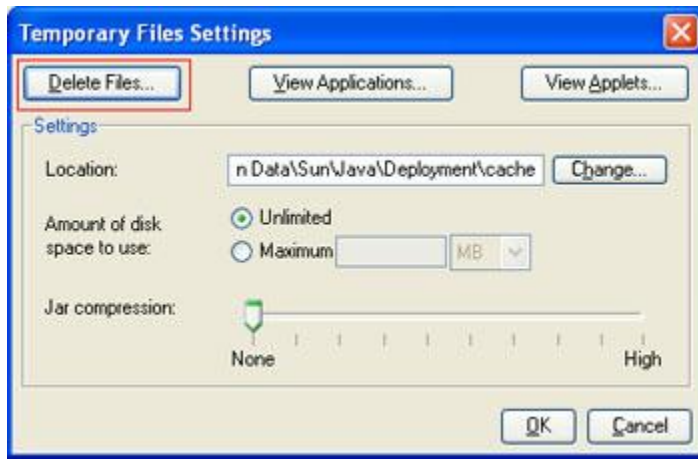
2. Double-click the Java icon in the Control Panel



3. The Java Control Panel appears



4. Click **Settings** under Temporary Internet Files.
5. The **Temporary Files Settings** dialog box appears.



6. Click **Delete Files**.
7. The **Delete Temporary Files** dialog box appears.



There are three options on this window to clear the cache

- a. Delete Files
- b. View Applications
- c. View Applets

8. Click **OK** on **Delete Temporary Files** window.
Note: This deletes all the Downloaded Applications and Applets from the cache.
9. Click **OK** on **Temporary Files Settings** window.
Note: If you want to delete a specific application and applet from the cache, click on View Application and View Applet options respectively.

Note: If you have updated Java installed, but does not have the icon for Java in the control panel you should:

Go to www.java.com > click on Free Java Download Button > Click Verify Java Version > Click link for all Java Downloads here > click on the 'Windows XP/Vista/2000/2003 Online' link > Click Run.

If you are unable to access www.java.com due to restrictions, you can go to <http://www.gmdit.com> > Click on the Workbench Support link > Under the Free Software Upgrades section at the top right click 'Java Runtime Plug-in' link > click on the 'Windows XP/Vista/2000/2003 Online' link > Click Run.
